A Message from Rozan Anderson

Dear WRJ,

This African proverb was presented by Rabbi Jon Prosnit recently at a leadership gathering at my congregation, Temple Beth El, in Madison, WI. He was quoting NJ Senator Cory Booker.

Throughout the past month, this has been part of many conversations at TBE, including within my own women's group, as we seek to move forward, increasing participation, not only in the number of people, but the quality of engagement.



Vote for the ARZA Slate in the Upcoming World Zionist Congress Elections

The World Zionist Congress (WZC) is often called the Parliament of the Jewish people. It meets every five years to bring Jews of the diaspora together to elect its leaders who

will then make policies for Israel's relationship to the diaspora and allocate over \$1 billion annually. It influences cultural, educational, and developmental activities in Israel. The WZC funds land purchases, pays rabbis, and does a variety of important other activities.

In the last few elections, the Association of Reform Zionists of America (ARZA) won the largest slate of representatives from North America. It has been able, therefore, to influence the WZC to support a pluralistic Israel, where all segments of the Jewish community can find a comfortable home.

Between March 10 and May 4, American Jews (18+) will choose candidates from over 20 diverse slates, ultimately electing 152 delegates -- approximately a third of the representatives to the next Congress. Subsequently, when the Congress convenes in Jerusalem in October, the elected delegates will determine how more than \$1 billion will be allocated annually to strengthen Jewish identity, enhance communities, and foster education worldwide, and will directly affect the Reform Movement in Israel.

You can vote online or through paper ballots. Please watch for alerts that will have links to the online voting starting on March 10. Encourage your women's group members and congregants to get involved and vote the ARZA slate. Reform Jews need to get out the vote to protect democracy in Israel and support the Reform movement there. Together, we will make a difference in this election. On A Roll - Hitting YES Fund Goals!

By definition, an honor roll is a list of the names of people who are celebrated for something they have done, such as doing very well in a sport or in

school. Honor roll in WRJ-world has a broader, more encompassing meaning. We celebrate your sisterhood or women's group when they earn a place on the WRJ YES Fund Honor Roll.

How, you ask? There are three levels of honor—Roll of Honor is reached at \$5/member, Special Merit is reached at \$10/member, and Chai Honor is reached at \$18/member. The WRJ YES Fund Honor Roll recognizes sisterhoods and women's groups who have gone above and beyond in their YES Fund donations. All donations made by members of a sisterhood or women's group are credited to the group's honor roll status. Honor roll status reports will be sent to your sisterhood so you can track your progress. Honor roll is evaluated on a fiscal year basis, meaning you have until June 30, 2025 to make our list!

Contributions to the YES Fund support WRJ's philanthropic endeavors to nurture the leaders of today and tomorrow in the Jewish community, reaching people at a local, national, and global level. In 2024-25, with \$300,500 in grant allocations, WRJ provided 28 grants to Jewish organizations around the world.

This grant can be used to help you defray the costs for ANY program or project that relates to engagement or social justice/advocacy.

Put a plan together and submit your grant application by June 30, 2025. You have plenty of time to plan. So develop your proposal, apply for a grant, promote your event, implement your program... and then revel in your success!

One of the most significant things we learned about Helen over the almost 20 years we knew her was her generosity. Helen loved WRJ and anything connected with it. Her donations were monumental, as she held eleven WRJ lifelines. When she served on the WRJ North American Board from January 2007 to November 2011, and they would meet in New York, two things were a given: she would bring treats for the staff and the Midwest board members (and maybe others), and she would walk almost any distance to get ice cream.

Helen was also instrumental in having the Jewish Braille Institute (JBI) create large-print prayer books to be purchased by our congregations.

Helen's generosity was known, at least to a group of Midwest women, when it came time for Chanukah. Suddenly we would get a mysterious package of 3M products. Helen was a special lady who will be greatly missed. Her memory will be for a blessing.
