

A Message from Rozan Anderson

Dear WRJ,

Last month's WRJ Rabbi Marla J. Feldman Social Justice Conference (SJC) was exactly where I needed to be in these days filled with uncertainty. Once again surrounded by my WRJ and Heartland community, I found the strength to raise my voice along with so many others who share my commitment to making this world better and more just for all. I could go on and on, but I will mention a few specific things that inspire me.

First of all, I was able to spend good, quality time with people from across our district (over 40, quite a few of whom were at their first WRJ event), as well as people from across North America and Israel. I had conversations where we shared what brought us to this place and time, and we built lovely and meaningful connections.

The Shabbat services were awesome – especially on Friday night, as we read piece after piece from WRJ's beautiful new book, "Covenant of Justice: Prayers, Poems, and Meditations from Women of Reform Judaism." Quite a few of the selections were written by people we know from Heartland. I look forward to spending more time with this book, and our delegation from Temple Beth El in Madison, WI, has gifted our entire senior staff with copies.

During both the WRJ North American Board meeting (just prior to SJC) and SJC, I attended quite a few sessions on how we can better foster belonging and make our spaces as safe as possible, both physically and psychologically. There is always plenty to consider.

With this in mind, I have invited WRJ Executive Committee member and Ethics Chair Betsey Hurwitz-Schwab to join us for our annual Heartland District Board meeting on Tuesday, June 3. 
