Devastating Earthquake and Tsunami in Japan

The March 11th earthquake and tsunami in Japan have caused widespread destruction and horrific human loss: a rapidly rising death toll, tens of thousands of people still missing, and hundreds of thousands displaced. Access to food, water, medicine, and electricity is becoming increasingly limited and humanitarian rescue and relief workers are laboring in freezing temperatures to find and care for survivors.

The receding of the waters did not end the damage brought about by the tsunami. It soon became evident that the nuclear facilities at Fukushima had been seriously damaged. <u>Heroic skeleton crews</u>, braving radiation, have been working around the clock to prevent a nuclear catastrophe.

WRJ has joined the <u>Jewish Coalition for Japan Relief</u> to respond to the needs of the Japanese people in dealing with this tragedy. The coalition provides a central location for donation of funds, as well as information about relief efforts and on the ground needs for member agencies. Funds collected by the coalition will be dedicated towards relief and recovery efforts in the affected region.

Women of Reform Judaism and the Religious Action Center invite you to participate in "Saving Reproductive Choice: A Conference Call Update" on Tuesday, March 22, at 12 p.m. EST. Cecile Richards, president of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America and the Planned Parenthood Action Fund, will talk about the current federal legislative attacks on reproductive rights and the serious threats they pose to women's lives.

Some members of Congress are threatening to drastically reduce access to affordable reproductive health services, contraception, pelvic exams, cancer screenings, STD testing and other essential women's health services.
