

## EFFECTIVE ACTION AGAINST AGGRESSION - 1950

---

*Whereas*, it has become obvious that, in case Security Council action against aggression is prevented or delayed, the United States must find other ways to maintain or restore peace; and

*Whereas*, the General Assembly under Articles 11 and 14 of the Charter has ample “authority and responsibility for matters affecting international peace,”

*Therefore*, be it resolved, that the 18th Biennial Assembly of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, convened in Cleveland, Ohio, November 12-15, 1950, records its approval of the action of the Fifth General Assembly in adopting, under the general head “The United Action for Peace,” the following measures: (1) that provision be made for immediate calling of an emergency session of the General Assembly, when needed, to recommend collective action against aggression; (2) that a peace observation commission be established to watch over and report on areas where aggression threatens; (3) that each member state designate certain units of its armed forces for United Nations use, and maintain them in readiness for service; and (4) that the General Assembly appoint a committee to study and report on the implementation of these measures.
