WRJ Social Justice Fund Naming and Sponsorship Opportunities

WRJ Advocacy Conference – \$500,000 Naming Gift

A gift of \$500,000 will name the WRJ conference designed to introduce women to a variety of public policy issues and educate them about the Jewish values that inform WRJ's advocacy. The program may stand alone or run concurrently with other events as part of WRJ's ongoing conference schedule.

WRJ RAC Legislative Assistant – \$360,000 to name or \$36,000 annually to sponsor

A dedicated WRJ Legislative Assistant (LA) based at the Religious Action Center (RAC) ensures that WRJ's voice is heard within the halls of power and that our women are informed of critical issues. A gift of \$360,000 will name the WRJ RAC LA program or the position may be underwritten for \$36,000 annually.

WRJ Social Justice Rabbinic Fellow – \$200,000 to name or \$20,000 annually to sponsor

Rabbinical students gain critical skills and knowledge through their student internships. This gift will allow WRJ to engage rabbinical students to promote the social justice agenda of WRJ.

WRJ Jane Evans “Pursuit of Justice” Award – \$50,000

Established in memory of WRJ’s first executive director, The Jane Evans Award is presented to a deserving humanitarian whose life and work exemplify WRJ’s values and ideals. Past honorees have included author Letty Cottin Pogrebin, Senator Barbara Boxer, Marcia Greenberger, Lilly Ledbetter, and IRAC director Anat Hoffman.

WRJ Covenant Book – \$36,000

WRJ will publish a collection of original prayers, meditations, poetry, and readings written by sisterhood women, students, and clergy on social justice themes. Multiple gifts may be accepted or combined to support this project.

WRJ Social Justice Pillars - \$10,000 each

WRJ – Educational Materials and Resources - \$5,000

Development of tools and resources for women to learn about critical issues and deepen their advocacy skills.

Each webinar focuses on one aspect of WRJ’s high priority issues and breaks it down by its history, why it is important to us as Reform Jewish women, and how to take action to create meaningful change.

Pledges for the Social Justice Fund are payable over 2 years unless alternative arrangements are made. A portion of donations will be used for administration, subject to the policies set forth by WRJ. Any excess funds not expended for the specified project will go into the WRJ Social Justice Fund to be used for WRJ’s current and future social action work. All donors and sponsors will be acknowledged at the 2019 Advocacy Conference and other appropriate venues.
