

A Message from Janet Buckstein Midwest District President

Greetings!

With the announcement of our WRJ Midwest District slate of nominees for our 2018-2020 Board of Directors, as well as the newly installed leadership at many sisterhoods and women's groups, our thoughts turn to the future. New leadership means new and fresh ideas and the excitement of paths not yet followed. However, our success also depends on all of us being prepared to tackle new challenges and that means taking the time to groom those who will succeed us.



I don't know about the rest of you, but the word *mentor* comes to my mind in thinking about how to support our incoming leaders. Usually I think of mentoring as helping someone grow into future roles, but it is equally, if not more, important in how we help our successors be the best they can be. As mentors, we are trusted counselors and guides. We teach, but in a very facilitative way, allowing our successors to define their roles and solutions.

Start with the basics... **TRANSFER YOUR FILES**! This includes job descriptions, time-lines, budgets, reports, and any flyers or letters you may have used. But also try to find a way to have a conversation with your successor to walk her through the information. You might include what you think the most important things were that you did to create success AND any challenges you may have faced. Most important, LISTEN to any concerns and brainstorm possible solutions.

Women's Group Presidents, even if you are continuing in your role, you may be working with a board that includes experienced and novice leaders. Your task can be daunting, but WRJ can provide support to assist you in your role:

If you are brand new...

- Make sure that your predecessor has notified WRJ of the transition.
 (WRJ Leadership Change Form) This is not just paperwork. It will assure that you receive information you will need to succeed. It will also invite you to join Yammer, a network that will provide connections to other women's group presidents throughout North America. Here is a link to tips on how to use Yammer.
- Check out the <u>Sisterhood/Women's Group Presidents Toolkit</u> in the Midwest District Leadership Group on Yammer for various checklists, sample job descriptions, and even information on "who to call for what"!

If you are new or continuing, assuming that everyone knows what to do in their new roles could prove disastrous for a new board and the coming year. In order to avoid any confusion, a new board training session may be helpful to the success of the board. In fact, here is a wonderful article penned by our own Michelle Scheinkopf onboard training sessions .

Finally, I must thank all of you who have served on the Midwest District Board during the past two years for your support and commitment; and congratulate all of you who will be serving, allowing us to "kvell" in your future accomplishments!



Articles & Information Help Protect Women's Health August 2018 CRITICAL ISSUES by Marilyn Glazer

This morning the Supreme Court of the United States ruled 5-4 in favor of the National Institute of Family and Life Advocates (NIFLA) v. Becerra, allowing medical professionals to omit full reproductive health care information to their

patients. Women of Reform Judaism condemns this decision to further restrict the reproductive rights of women. We must continue to act to demand full access to women's health care.

On June 1st, the Department of Health and Human Services proposed an amendment to Title X to ensure compliance with, and enhance implementation of, the requirement that no funds under this federal grant program may be used in programs where abortion is a method of family planning. This regulation, commonly known as the "domestic gag rule," would undermine a woman's right to choose her own medical decisions and would allow healthcare professionals to withhold accurate and timely medical information from patients.

Title X is the United States' only program dedicated to providing affordable reproductive health care on the federal level, helping 4 million women nationwide. Currently the law states that funding cannot go to abortion services, but organizations that perform abortions with their own money can still receive funding to provide other health care services. This proposed rule would eliminate all federal funding to any organization that provides or refers for abortion services.

Since our resolution in 1935 on Birth Control Literature, WRJ has continued to fight for a woman's right to choose, the sanctity of the doctor-patient relationship, and access to health care.

Consistent with our longstanding background of actions towards reproductive rights, WRJ urges you to demonstrate your strong opposition to this deeply destructive proposal.
