The **Women's March on Chicago** will be starting at the Petrillo Bandshell in Grant Park at 10 am. You can <u>register</u> on their website. If you will be marching, please be sure to take lots of photos and send them to the district and to WRJ. Consider posting your photos and reflections on social media. And don't forget to wear your "I Am a Woman of Reform Judaism" pins and other

If you will be joining the *Women's March on Washington*, consider joining others from the Reform Movement for Shabbat worship at 8:30am led by local DC-area clergy. Following worship, from 9:30am – 3:45pm, the Religious Action Center (RAC) is hosting a hospitality space with refreshments, restrooms, and a place to congregate and reflect. The North American Federation of Temple Youth (NFTY) Convention is coming to the **Hyatt Regency Chicago Hotel** on Wacker Drive from **February 17-20** (Presidents' Day weekend) and WRJ has asked us to be involved!

NFTY Convention is a high-energy biennial gathering, where over 1000 teens will have the opportunity to meet with other engaged teens (grades 9-12th) from across the country, interact with an amazing array of guest lecturers, rabbis, and educators; and be inspired by ideas and

Why WRJ Midwest at a NFTY Convention you ask?

Since the convention is being held in Chicago, the Midwest District has been asked by WRJ to be the local WRJ representative at this assembly. WRJ would like us to provide coverage at the WRJ Booth at the NFTY Resource Mall during specific times at the convention. Here we will have the opportunity to share with teenagers and their adult youth advisors the amazing things WRJ does for them now and in their futures. We will literally be planting the seeds (our legacy) for these young women and their future involvement in WRJ.

Specifically, we have been asked to inform students about our WRJ Distracted Driving resolution and ask them to sign the Distracted Driving Pledge. This is the same pledge many of you signed at our biennial convention in Downers Grove last October. At the NFTY convention, the teens will be attending programming on a host of social action issues. This is our opportunity to also engage with them on issues and resolutions such as pay equity, gender equality, and paid family medical leave that are important to the Women of Reform Judaism.


