





## WRJ Midwest Convention 2016

We are so thrilled that our special quest will be none other than Sara Charney, WRJ Vice President. She is from Holy Blossom Temple in Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

While pursuing and after completing her doctorate in Italian Renaissance literature at the University of Toronto, Sara Charney taught Italian language and literature in the Department of Italian Studies at the University of Toronto. She took leave from her position to raise her three children and, as time allowed, began to engage in a variety of volunteer activities.

Charney, a member of Holy Blossom Temple in Toronto, has been president of that temple's



forward the Torat Chayim Project to the temple which was a community building initiative to write a new Torah scroll in honor of Holy Blossom Temple's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

She has served on both the board and executive committee of Holy Blossom as a department chair and recently coordinated a new leadership development initiative. In that capacity, she developed a membership 101 program for new and current members.

Charney joined Women of Reform Judaism's board of directors in 2005 and then the Executive Committee in 2007. She completed a two-year tenure as local arrangements co-chair for WRJ's 2009 Assembly in Toronto, at which time she was installed as a vice president of WRJ. Sara served as WRJ vice president of Marketing and Communications from 2009-2011. At the December 2011 WRJ assembly in Washington, Sara was re-installed as a vice-president, assuming the portfolio of Service to Sisterhoods and Districts. In March, 2013, Sara co-chaired WRJ's 10-day Centennial Mission to Israel and Berlin. At the December 2013 WRJ assembly in San Diego, Sara was installed as vice-president of a new WRJ portfolio, Programs and WRJ Education.



The theme of the convention is B'reishit... a New Beginning. Creating our WRJ Community One Woman at a Time. We are hoping that this event will kick-off a time of building and fostering a WRJ-wide family where every member has an opportunity to learn, grow and feel part of a nurturing community of Reform Jewish women.
